- SBIR/STTR Programs Extended to December 16, 2011; Reauthorization Efforts Continue

On November 18, the NIH posted a notice on their SBIR/STTR News Flash Page (http://grants.nih.gov/grants/funding/sbirsttr_news.htm#20111005) that 'Congress has extended the SBIR and STTR programs through December 16, 2011. The programs were set to expire on November 18, 2011.'

This week, the Senate amended the National Defense Authorization bill to include a reauthorization of the SBIR/STTR programs for another eight years. This effort was led by U.S. Senator Mary L. Landrieu,, Chair of the Senate Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship. Press releases regarding the bill are available on the SBE website: <http://sbc.senate.gov/public/>.

Dear SBIR/STTR Advocates,

This week, by a unanimous voice vote, the Senate amended the National Defense Authorization bill to include a reauthorization of the Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) and Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) programs for another eight years giving small businesses confidence that the program is going to go on.

Prior to this vote, Congress had passed 14 temporary extensions of the SBIR and STTR programs since 2008. Unfortunately, the fight is not over. There is one more hurdle to jump over to make it to the finish line. We must make sure our colleagues on the House side do not strip this crucial legislation as with years past.

You may think this bill will easily pass the House with bipartisan support given the overwhelming bipartisan support in the Senate and broad support from groups such as the National Small Business

Association, the National Federation of Independent Businesses, the U.S Chamber of Commerce and BIO. The Senate version has the most support and we hope the House will join us in getting a long-term SBIR/STTR reauthorization across the finish line.

Please call your Member of the House and urge them to speak to their colleagues who will be involved in these negotiations to reach a compromise before the National Defense bill is sent to the President. We must stress the importance of this legislation; we must make sure they understand the necessity of these programs to keep our nation on the forefront of defense technology and scientific innovation.

Did you know?

- This reauthorizes the programs for 8 years.
- The amendment increases the SBIR program allocation by one percent, from 2.5 to 3.5 percent, over ten years, and increases the STTR program allocation from .3 percent to .6 percent over six years.
- It makes firms majority owned and controlled by multiple venture capital firms eligible for up to 25 percent of the SBIR funds at NIH, NSF and DoE and up to 15 percent of the funds at the other eight agencies. The authority is in effect for five years, as modified by Sen. McCain.
- 3 percent of the SBIR allocation will go to administrative, oversight and processing costs if there is an allocation increase.
- The amendment increases the award guidelines for SBIR and STTR awards from \$100,000 to \$150,000 for Phase I and from \$750,000 to \$1 million for Phase II, allowing for one sequential Phase II.

-- DOE FY 2012 SBIR/STTR Phase I Release 2 Funding Opportunity Now Available

The Department of Energy (DOE) SBIR/STTR Programs Office released their 2012 SBIR/STTR Phase I, Release 2 Funding Opportunity Announcement on November 28, 2011. It is available to view/download in pdf file format on the DOE SBIR/STTR Funding Opportunities page at <http://science.energy.gov/sbir/funding-opportunities/>.

DOE anticipates making approximately 80 awards in amounts up to \$150,000 under this FOA. Phase II grant awards are expected to be in amounts up to \$1,000,000.

If you are interested in submitting an application, you need to submit a letter of intent by December 20, 2011. SBIR and STTR grant applications are due January 31, 2012.

DOE points out that there are several important items to keep in mind if you are planning on submitting an application:

- All Phase I applications must be submitted through Grants.gov web portal to be considered for award.
- First Time applicants to Grants.gov
 - You cannot submit an application through Grants.gov unless you are registered. Prior to registering in Grants.gov you must
 - Obtain a Dun and Bradstreet Data Universal Numbering Systems (DUNS) number.
 - Register with the Central Contractor Registration (CCR) via the credential provider
 - See Grants.gov "Get Registered" and use the Grants.gov Organization Registration Checklist to guide you through the process.
 - Allow at least 21 days to complete this process. Start NOW!
 - Previously Registered Applicants
 - You must update your Central Contractor Registration (CCR) number each year. If you have any questions about your CCR, please contact the Grants.gov Helpdesk at 1-800-518-4726. (Each year we administratively decline applications that were submitted late because of failure to update a CCR number Do it NOW!)

-- DOC NOAA SBIR 2012-1 Phase I Solicitation Released

The Department of Commerce (DOC) National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) issued their 2012-1 Phase 1 SBIR solicitation on November 16, 2011. The deadline for receipt of proposals is February 1, 2012. The solicitation is available to download on the Federal Business Opportunities (www.fedbizopps.gov) website at https://www.fbo.gov/index?s=opportunity&mode=form&id=fada14ff631c75636708234c986f3c3b&tab=core&_cview=1.

As indicated in the solicitation, NOAA anticipates making approximately 15 Phase I firm-fixed prices contracts of no more than \$95,000. Phase II awards of up to \$400,000 will be awarded to approximately half of the Phase I awardees, depending on the availability of funds.
