- SBIR/STTR Programs Extension Notice

As indicated in the notice below, which was posted April 26, 2010 on the NIH SBIR/STTR News Flash Page (http://grants.nih.gov/grants/funding/sbirsttr_news.htm#20100204), Congress has extended the SBIR/STTR Programs until July 31, 2010:

Congress Again Extends SBIR/STTR Programs (Through July 31, 2010)

Congress has again extended the SBIR and STTR programs "as is" through July 31, 2010. This extension affects ten of the eleven agencies (including NIH) that participate in SBIR. DoD's programs were previously extended through September 30, 2010, as part of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2010 and are not affected by this recent extension.

The closing date for the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) SBIRPhase I program solicitation (RFP# PR-NC-10-10251) is May 11, 2010. The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Science & Technology (S&T) Directorate posted a notice announcing the pre-release of their FY10.2 Solicitation, DHS SBIR-2010.2 on April 26, 2010, on the News and Events page of their SBIR website (www.sbir.dhs.gov). On April 30, a notice in the Federal Business Opportunities (<http://www.fedbizopps.gov>) website indicated that the deadline for submission of proposals was changed to June 24, 2010, and the deadline for contact with the technical points of contact for each topic has been extended to May 11, 2010.

During the period April 26, 2010 through May 11, 2010, proposers have an opportunity to contact Technical Points of Contact by telephone or by email to ask technical questions about specific technical topics contained in this Solicitation.
