-- ED OSERS/NIDRR FY 2010 SBIR Solicitation Opens

The Department of Education (ED) Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services (OSERS) National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research (NIDRR) SBIR program released a Notice Inviting Applications for New Awards for Fiscal Year (FY) 2010 on January 13, 2010 on the ED SBIR website (<http://www.ed.gov/programs/sbir/index.html>).

As indicated in the application notice, all SBIR projects funded by NIDRR must address the needs of individuals with disabilities and their families. (See 29 U.S.C. 762). Activities may include: conducting manufacturing related R&D that encompasses improvements in existing methods or processes, or wholly new processes, machines, or systems; exploring the uses of technology to ensure equal access to education, employment, community environments, and information for individuals with disabilities; and improving the quality and utility of disability and rehabilitation research

For FY 2010 these priorities are:

- (1) Increased independence of individuals with disabilities in the workplace, recreational settings, or educational settings through the development of technology to support access and promote integration of individuals with disabilities
- (2) Enhanced sensory or motor function of individuals with disabilities through the development of technology to support improved functional capacity.
- (3) Enhanced workforce participation through the development of technology to support access to employment, promote sustained employment, and promote employment advancement for individuals with disabilities.
- (4) Enhanced community participation and living for individuals with disabilities through the development of accessible information technology including Web access technology, software, and other systems and devices that promote access to information in educational, employment, and community settings, and voting technology that improves access for individuals with disabilities.
- (5) Improved interventions and increased use of health-care resources through the development of technology to support independent access to health-care services in the community for individuals with disabilities.

ED anticipates making approximately 15 grant awards for periods up to six months in amounts up to \$75,000. Phase II awards are for periods up to two years in the maximum amount of \$500,000 for the two-year performance period. The due date and time for the receipt of applications is Mar. 15, 2010.

#### -- DoD SBIR and STTR Program Overview

The deadline to submit a proposal in response to the first of three 2010 Department of Defense (DoD) SBIR Solicitations passed last week, however, the first of two 2010 DoD STTR solicitations will be posted on the DoD SBIR/STTR Web Site (<http://www.acq.osd.mil/osbp/sbir/index.htm>) on January 25, 2010, and will begin accepting proposals on February 23, 2010. To help people learn more about their SBIR/STTR programs, DoD recently updated their Overview page (<http://www.acq.osd.mil/osbp/sbir/overview/index.htm>) on their website. They have also posted a two-page flyer which outlines program information and details pertaining to the current fiscal year on this page.

#### -- SBIR Reauthorization Update

Despite the fact that SBIR/STTR programs will expire on January 31, 2010 unless reauthorization is reached or another CR (continuing resolution) is made, Rich Shindell from the SBIR Gateway (<http://www.zyn.com/sbir/>) reported in the January 11, 2010 edition of the SBIR Insider Newsletter that “we are no closer today to SBIR reauthorization than we were when the House and Senate SBIR legislation was passed back in July of 2009 with conference talks starting in August.” The issues that continue to be debated include:

- Length of Reauthorization
- Venture Capital Participation in SBIR
- Award Levels
- Sequential Phase II Award
- Retention of Phase I Requirement
- Allocation Increase
- Administrative Funds
- Rural and State Outreach
